## **CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON**

Advent has arrived, which is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians across the world. Our liturgical calendar follows a three-year cycle (called Years A, B, and C). We are beginning Year C. When you take a look forward at Year C, an interesting pattern stands out. If we set aside the 24 Sundays of Ordinary Time (which is the time of year after Pentecost until the end of the liturgical year at Christ the King Sunday), that leaves 28 Sundays to observe days such as Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter. Of all those remaining Sundays, 10 of them will be spent in Advent and Lent. That's noteworthy, because Advent and Lent are both seasons of waiting. Advent and Lent are both seasons of preparation. They are seasons in which we journey with the Lord.

Think about that. A lot of the liturgical year (10 Sundays) is spent in times of waiting, times during which we are in no place in particular but are waiting (hoping) to arrive somewhere eventually. Isn't that a lot like life itself? We journey during life feeling like we have not quite arrived yet. Seasons like Advent give us hope, however, that our waiting is not in vain. Whatever you are waiting for in your life right now, Advent is for you. For many people, Advent is wrapped up in the joyful anticipation of Christmas and the "most wonderful time of year." For many other people, Advent is a time of dark winter and the feelings of grief and loss. Here is our hope: in whatever state you find yourself (whether joy or sorrow), Advent is for you. Advent promises that our waiting will come to an end and that God will act on our behalf right when we need God. In the meantime, God remains waiting with us wherever we are. God waits with us in our sadness. God waits with us in our joy. As you wait this Advent, have hope that God waits with you.

### What is a Blue Christmas Service?

This year's Blue Christmas Service will be offered on December 21 at 7:00pm, in person in our sanctuary and live-streamed. Blue Christmas services typically take place on the winter solstice. We often think of the winter solstice as the shortest day of the year, but it is also the night with the longest period of darkness. You can choose to attend or participate in a Blue Christmas service for many reasons. Some people come because they are experiencing grief, illness, fractured relationships, depression, anxiety, or any number of other things that make being joyful during the Christmas season difficult. Others may come to support or pray for loved ones who are experiencing a time of difficulty.

It may sound like this service would not fit in with the time of hope and celebration we experience at Advent and Christmas, but the purpose of the service is to remind us of the joy that we ALL share in the Incarnation. Rev. Christa Brewer at First Presbyterian Church in Myrtle Beach has held Blue Christmas services for the last several years, and she notes that, "The Incarnation is a reason for celebration that God loved us so much that God sent Jesus to be with us, but it is also a reason for celebration that Jesus came to walk with us through the pains of life as well. I wish we could better hold these two messages together."

### **Stewardship Campaign Report**

We are off to a very good start in our 2022 campaign. As of November 16, we have received 119 pledges totaling \$376,000. This is 14 fewer pledges but \$3,000 more in commitments than at this point in last year's campaign. We are overjoyed by the response from pledges received; a total of 61 families (51%) increased their pledge over last year while only 11 found it necessary to reduce their 2022 commitment. Forty families pledged the same as last year while an additional seven families either pledged for the first time or resumed pledging. Your support of our church mission is most gratifying and we look forward to exceeding last year's pledge total of \$487,000!!

We are most grateful for membership support of our ministry. As a reminder, here are some potential 2021 income tax savings associated with charitable giving:

 You may take a deduction for charitable cash contributions up to \$600 for married filers even if you do not itemize deductions.

 Avoid Capital Gains Tax by directly contributing appreciated stock from a non-retirement investment account. (Contact Maria in the office)

 Required Minimum Distribution: If you qualify for and direct a portion of your RMD to a charitable organization that amount is not taxable. However, it cannot also be included as a charitable deduction.

As always, consult your tax advisor on tax savings strategies.

### Backpack Ministry - It's for the kids!

School is back and so is our "We Have Your Back" Backpack Program! This ministry is devoted to helping children in our community get the food and nourishment they need on the weekends when they are not in school, via backpacks delivered to their school every Friday during the school year. We have been working with School 54 and School 35 in Rochester to reach a number of kids that are considered at "extreme risk of hunger". These are kids who, without help, likely would go hungry on Saturday and Sunday.

This is our tenth year of driving this program, and we have been blessed with a number of wonderful people in our congregation who have helped a great deal by donating time, money and food to help us reach these needy children. Rochester is now #3 in the country in terms of childhood poverty rate: 56.4% - three times the national average! (Rochester D&C)

#### We need food (or money) and occasional volunteers

 Volunteers are needed to deliver to the 2 schools on Fridays. If you'd like to volunteer, contact Dave Testa at dtesta@rochester.rr.com or 585-355-2000.

 Donate food - prepared pasta meals or boxes of macaroni and cheese are especially needed (there is a box in the lobby closet for your food donations).

 Donate money – even easier, you may give or mail a check to Maria in the church office made out to our church and she will ensure it is used immediately and specifically for the program (please note "for backpack program" on your check). \$25 would feed 8 kids on the weekend.

Regardless of how you help, we know it will make a difference in the lives of these children.

Goal: To recognize God's surprising love in Jesus Christ.


