# CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

Happy New Year! There is something satisfying about turning the page of a calendar or about writing a new year number every time you date a document. After the doozy of a year we had in 2020, I think we all assumed 2021 would surely be an improvement. Well, 2021 sure gave 2020 a run for its money! I'm looking forward to what 2022 has in store for us, because I cannot help being hopeful.

The celebration of a new year is a perfect opportunity to remember that the message of the Gospel is about new beginnings, new opportunities, and new life. There is a verse in the book of Revelation that I especially like. The author of Revelation is describing the future day when God will make a new creation, when Jesus says in 21:5, "Behold, I am making all things new!" I think I especially like this verse because of the very specific wording that is used in it. Notice that Jesus did not say, "I am making all new things." Instead, he said, "I am making all things new."

You'll notice that there is a significant difference between making "all new things" and making "all things new." When Christ's work of salvation reaches its completion in the future, and he destroys the powers of sin and death, once and for all, he is not going to destroy you and me and the earth we live on along with it. He loves his creation. He is not going to scrap it and start over. He is going to simply remove all of its imperfections. The image Revelation 21:5 depicts for us conjures up many ideas, but there is one that I think is particularly relevant for us in 2022. The saving work of God is a work of renewal, not destruction. You and I are the culmination of all the experiences we've ever had. We cannot change the past, but we can allow God's saving grace to work in us to make our lives and experiences (as affected by sin and death, as they are) full of meaning and beauty. The journey we've been on at First Presbyterian Church over the last two years has been hard, as we've faced so many challenges due to the ongoing pandemic. But Christ promises to make all things new. There is nothing that Christ cannot redeem. Together, let's look forward to the new year with hope and prepare to see all that God is going to renew in us.

# UPDATE! Stewardship Campaign Report

As of December 14, we have received 154 pledges totaling \$464,000. This is 22 fewer commitments, but \$8,000 more in dollars than this point in last year's campaign. It is very gratifying to see that 50% of households increased their pledge over last year while only 14 households found it necessary to reduce their 2022 commitment. It is also encouraging that 11 households either made a pledge for the first time or resumed pledg-ing in 2022. We are within \$23,000 of matching 2021 commitments, which would be a significant turnaround in pledge trends. A thank you to those who have made a commitment and an invitation to those who have not yet pledged to do so by year's end.

# Synod of the Northeast Scholarships and Interest-Free Student Loans

The Wurffel-Sills Scholarship & Interest-Free Student Loan Program will begin accepting applications for the 2022-2023 school year in mid-January 2022. All full-time undergraduate students and full -time or part-time (at least half-time) seminary students (MDiv and MRE) who are members of a church within the Synod of the Northeast are eligible to apply. In addition to these, they will also begin to accept applications for those enrolled in coursework to obtain their CRE. The deadline to apply is April 1, 2022 for funding to begin in the Fall of 2022.
