A WEE WORD FROM DR. WEENINK

Epiphanies, Revelations and Reminders

It was a Christmas Eve epiphany. It happened twenty-five years ago, but the experience is still vividly in my mind's eye, as if it happened yesterday. Our Family Christmas Eve Service took place in the Chapel at 5:30 pm. It was a progressive and highly participatory Christmas pageant. It was always a bit of a boisterous, raucous, noisy, excited worship event. The chancel was set up with risers, a huge illuminated star, and, of course the manger complete with a slumbering, baby doll Jesus in it. Mothers, Fathers, Grandmas, Grandpas, Brothers, Sisters, Aunts, and Uncles with exuberant children everywhere—they all took their places. Every seat was filled. Then arrived the time in the service when the pageant began. Children played the parts. They dressed—oh so fittingly. There was Mary and Joseph. There were angels with halos and wings and shepherds with burlap-like-looking shawls. Everything went well. No one missed a prompt or an appearance. Everything was in keeping with the script.

Then came the Wise Men wearing their robes and crowns. Said the narrator in keeping with the mime of entering royalty—"where is he who is born King of the Jews." (Matthew 2:2) Then it happened—something that was not in the script. Little two-and-a-half-year-old Kailyn, wearing white, adorned with wings and a halo made out of pipe cleaners piped out. She spoke up with the innocent clarion quality only a child can exclaim: "He's right there!" She pointed to the manger. The congregation broke out in mirthful laughter. It was a priceless instant. Beneath the humor of the moment, was a profound event—a revelation. It wasn't in the script, but it was a true Epiphany.

The word Epiphany comes from the Greek verb *epiphanein*, meaning 'to show' or 'to appear.' Other English words find derivation from it: 'cellophane,' because what's underneath shows. 'Fancy' and 'fantasy' and 'phantom,' alluding to appearance. Epiphany is the appearance of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, all the non-Jewish peoples of the world who previously didn't bow to the king of Israel. Epiphany is the full manifestation of God in human form—Immanuel—God with us.

Kailyn said it best - "He's right there."

The central claim of the Christian faith is that in Jesus Christ God came near. Christ's giving of himself away for others was nothing less than God's giving God's own self away, surrendering to the forces of death, so that everlasting, abundant new life could be released upon the world. I like the way the Biblical scholar Marcus Borg puts it: "Jesus discloses that at the center of everything is a reality that is in love with us.... At the center of this reality, there is one who is in love with us and who wills our well-being. Jesus counters the conventional wisdom's understanding of God as one who makes demands on us and before whom we must cower and fear." He reveals God as the compassionate God who wants to be close to us; who is the force of the transformation of all of human life. (Borg, Jesus: A New Vision)

For John Calvin, this was God's great genius. He wrote, "In Christ, God made himself little in order to accommodate himself to our capacity." [cf Readings in Calvin's Theology – Donald McKim, p. 42.]

Remember little Kailyn's insight when you ask:

Where is the God child? -

He's right there!

When times are tough and the way is not clear—remember —

He's right there!

When doubts plague and uncertainties overwhelm—remember —

He's right there!

When fear overcomes you—remember —

He's right there!

In the gladness and glory of this epiphany—

In the assurance of Christ's continued presence –

May we all have an abundantly blessed New Year in faith, fun, fulfillment, fellowship, worship, service, study, and spiritual formation.

Remember—through all of these things — He's right there!

News from the Nursery School




