MUSINGS FROM REV. STEVE

Dear Friends,

Attitude Counts! A while ago the Rev. David Tinker wrote an article that focused on "Attitude." He pointed out that our attitude always brings one of two things to those around us: blessings or bruises. The choice is ours. In the course of this day, we will encounter many people. Tonight, they might talk about us. Will they say, "I met this person today who was the most cheerful person I ever met." Or will they say, "Let me tell you about the grouch I had to deal with earlier." Will they remember you or me as a blessing in their day or as a bruise? Will they be glad for the encounter we had or mad about it? Will they look forward to seeing us again? Or, will once have been one time too many? Will the people we encounter even remember us? Do we want them to remember us? I hope the answer to these last two questions is yes.

We are Christians. We are called to leave an impression. Remember the scripture verses about Christians (you and I) being the salt of the earth and the light on the hill? (*Matthew 5:13-15*) Wherever we go we leave behind us, embedded in the minds, hearts, and souls of those we encounter the impression of God. As long as we, in any manner, bear the identity of "Christian," the things we say and do and our attitude will either draw people closer to God or will push people away from God.

During the Christmas season we greet each other with "Merry Christmas!" But do we leave one another merry? Do we in our encounters increase the joy of those around us? And, now that Christmas is over, are we still actively trying to help people be merry? Or has that been packed away for the season along with the rest of our Christmas ornaments? Are we still wearing a merry attitude in the spring of our step, the lilt of our voice, and in the sparkle of our eyes? God needs us to be faithful witnesses always, but especially in the gray times of life. And, as we know well, January and February especially in Rochester can be pretty gray. Our attitude says more to others about our understanding of God; about our connection to God than our words. In the days ahead we may have gray skies, but thanks to the birth of our Lord, a bright light is always present and ready to be shared.

Let us begin the New Year with a determination to keep our attitude connected to the joyous reality of Emmanuel, God With Us. Let us look for the light of his presence and let us be ever ready to bring the hope of that light to others. Attitude Counts!



Pastor Nominating Committee Report

Our 11 person committee prepared our church's resume (MIF) about one year ago and submitted it to PCUSA National Headquarters in Louisville, KY. We started reviewing batches of pastoral candidates that matched our requirements (Education level, Experience as Head of Staff, Leadership Competencies, Salary range, etc). The second step was phone interviews with our entire committee. The third step was SKYPE interviews on-line where we could see the candidate and talk on more in-depth topics.

In April 2019, we invited two candidates to Pittsford for Neutral Pulpit visits. This is a 2-3 day intensive interview culminating in hearing the candidate preach at a Presbyterian church in our area. Neither of these first two candidates were the right fit for FPC. The next two candidates to get invited for neutral pulpit visits were here when Pastor Carrie Mitchell announced her resignation. Both candidates withdrew their names from consideration because they felt our requirements had significantly changed.

We spent the summer revising our resume (MIF) and had the third set of two candidates come into town in October. We offered the Head of Staff position to one candidate and the "Call" was accepted. During the next six weeks we worked out the logistics of Committee on Ministry interview, preaching at our church, negotiating salary, along with many other details. A few days before we could announce the candidate's name and relevant dates, the candidate changed their mind. We continue to meet as a PNC and will have a new Head of Staff Pastor "SOON." We just don't know what soon means in GOD's time frame. Dan Traina & Lew Becker, Committee Co-Chairs.

Vital Congregation Initiative Update

We are just weeks away from the start of our Revitalization through the Vital Congregation Initiative. The materials have been received and the VCI Cohort, as well as First Presbyterian Ministers, are excited to get started on our Lenten study that will begin in earnest in February as we explore "The Seven Marks of a Vital Congregation."

LIFELONG Discipleship Formation vs. complacent "Christian" piety, simply teaching good morals, or offering the latest program

Intentional, Authentic Evangelism vs. "Jesus freaks;" "Christian" hypocrisy; a committee

Outward Incarnational Focus vs. inward institutional survival; closed communities of assimilation/exclusion

Empower Servant Leadership vs. the Pastor's job; monopolized leadership; hiring the young, energetic pastor

Spirit-Inspired Worship vs. self-gratifying worship, stale ritual divorced of meaning, or consumer entertainment worship

Caring Relationships vs. any other social club; façades, hypocrisy, and judgment of "church" and "religion."

Ecclesial Health vs. unhealthy dysfunction; toxic environments; obsolete and irrelevant buildings

Our next Cohort meeting will take place at First Presbyterian on January 8th as our VCI team hosts other church cohorts from the presbytery of Genesee Valley.

Stay tuned for more information about how the entire congregation can be involved in this important initiative.
