Embracing and Sharing Christ's Love

**CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON**

Many of the Church's rituals and practices that we know today were codified after Christianity became the religion of Rome in the fourth century AD. The Church's observance of Lent seems to be firmly established by this time. However, a time of preparation leading up to Easter seems to have been the practice of the church from nearly its beginning. Before it was a season of forty days, it seems to have been a time of fasting and prayer for a few days before the Easter vigil, especially for new believers who were preparing to be baptized at the vigil.

We don't tend to observe Lent this way anymore. Modern-day Protestants don't generally hold Easter as the ideal date to baptize new believers, as the early church did; so Lent does not, for us, have the association with preparation for baptism that it used to hold. (Although I do think it's very appropriate that I will be leading a new members' class during Lent, with some new members set to join the church on Palm Sunday!)

I want you to try to imagine something with me. Try to imagine you have no or little familiarity with Christianity. What would you want to know about this new religion? What would you expect to learn from adherents to this religion? What would you want to know about the church and its purpose? Learning the answers to these questions would tell you something about the very heart of the Christian faith. Even if you are not a new believer right now, pondering these questions is exactly the sort of thing Lent is meant to offer us. Lent is a time to reconsider the meaning and purpose of everything we do as followers of Christ.

So why are you here? How does Jesus impact your life? What makes the church important in the world? What makes it different than anything else? As we begin our strategic planning process this year, it is my hope that our answers to these questions will become known to us with greater clarity.

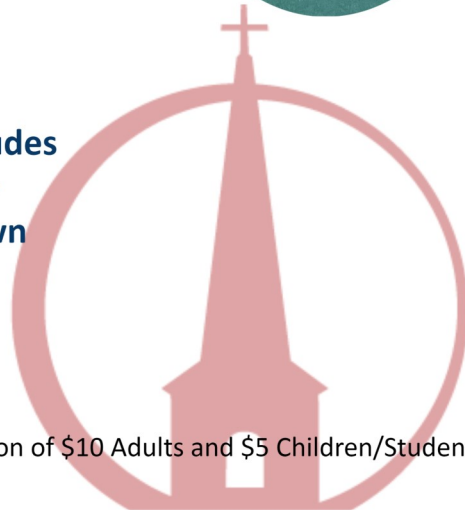
**Give Me Your Hand: A Celebration of Women Poets**

**Heather Holmquest, soprano**

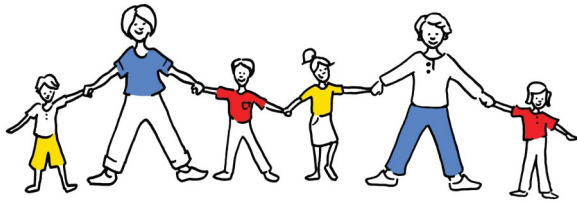

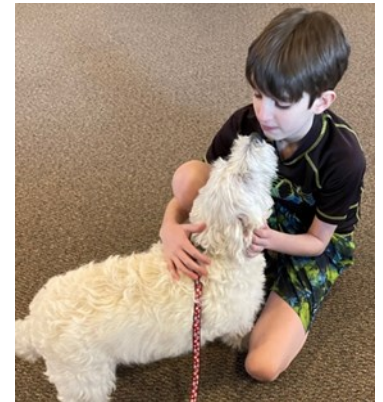

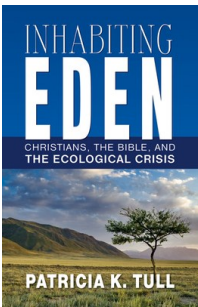

## Author of *Inhabiting Eden* coming on March 5

On March 5, the author of *Inhabiting Eden*, the Rev. Dr. Patricia Tull, will be preaching at both services. Also after worship, Dr. Tull will be teaching two lectures in room 201. The first lecture will cover questions and discussion about her book, and the zero energy home she lives in. The second lecture will tap into her experience as a professor of the Old Testament to talk about hard passages in the first half of the Bible. This will be a time to ask hard questions about the God we see in those texts.

Food will be provided upstairs so that people can stay and hear the lectures.



Patricia K. Tull is the author of the Bible study *Inhabiting Eden: Christians, the Bible, and the Ecological Crisis* (Westminster/John Knox), as well as the 2024-2025 Horizons Bible Study on environmental justice. As A.B. Rhodes Professor Emerita of Old Testament at Louisville Seminary, she has devoted her post-academic life to environmental theology. She is a Climate Reality presenter, a GreenFaith fellow, former program director for Hoosier Interfaith Power & Light, and the 2016 recipient of the William Gibson Eco-Justice Award. She and her spouse, the Rev. Don Summerfield, live in a net-zero energy home outside of Henryville, Indiana.
