CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

In my annual report article, I reminded the members of our congregation of the four strategic objectives that came out of our Faith Forward initiative, which are:

- Everyday Faith to reimagine discipleship to become highly personal, relational, and biblical.
- **Groups and Gatherings** to provide safe places, times, and gatherings for people to connect on the journey.
- Pittsford Connects to reimagine our campus to become a safe place that meets our neighbors' "first" needs (physical, social, and emotional).
- **Re-align to our True North** to reduce the amount of organizational bloat while refining structures to support what matters the most.

So what do these objectives mean for us? Right now, these objectives are just hopes and aspirations. In other words, it is business as usual until changes are actually implemented to move us toward achieving these objectives. Who will be implementing any changes and when will they happen? The Session is the council responsible for leading the congregation, and they have only just begun to discuss which of the four objectives to focus on first and what actions to take to move the objective forward. I assure you that the Session will continue to keep you informed along the way.

With Easter right around the corner, I cannot help but think about our story in connection to the Resurrection story. Indeed, we are people of the Resurrection. As Christians, each day is about surrendering to God parts of our lives that need to die and allowing the Holy Spirit to make us like Christ. Our church, as a collection of all of us individually, is on the same journey. Resurrection can be disorienting and even frightening. Not only does a death precede it, but, as the story of Christ's own resurrection tells us, the act of resurrection can be scary. When Jesus rose from the dead, there was an earthquake, bright lights, and loud noises! It's no wonder the angel said to the disciples who were at the empty tomb, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said" (Matthew 28:5-6). As we continue on this Faith Forward journey together, there may be times when we feel a little confused and afraid. May we remember to keep seeking the risen Christ and discover that, as the angel told the disciples, there is no reason to be afraid.





In-Step Children's Home — Trip Report January 2024



A team of 13 volunteers went to the In-Step Children's Home in Kitale, Kenya, from January 5–21, 2024. Our church and Outreach Committee sponsored and led the trip. We had an eight-person dental team led by Dr. Cindy & Gary Groves (Booneville) and Dr. Cathy Harrison (Fairport). We also had three dental assistants, Laura & Noelle Woodruff (United Methodist Church of Livonia) and Sue Wester (Livonia Community Church). Our own Ginny Vorhis was the lab tech responsible for sterilizing equipment and Kathy Van Buskirk (Conesus UCC) was our office manager. We had

never taken three dentists before but now that we have a portable low-speed hand-held dental unit, we are able to accomplish more dentistry. For the first time, all 186 children aged five and up got dental exams, full teeth cleanings, and fluoride treatments. We also performed over 60 dental procedures (fillings, extractions, etc.). We even had time to do procedures on the staff that work at In-Step.

The remainder of the team were teachers, coaches, and photographer. Dan Harrison taught classes on how to make miniature race cars using popsicle sticks, batteries, rubber bands, tires, electric motors and glue stick guns. The children learned to solder, design, decorate, and build their own cars. Then we had a race at the end of our stay where prizes were awarded. A great event to see which children have a spark for engineering. Dean & Tammie Myslecevek (Spencerport Wesleyan) are recently retired teachers from Gates Chili HS and Roberts College. They taught numerous classes in science, math, and environmental studies. They also taught the teachers how to be more effective instructors, especially at the high school level. Flinn Hackett (St. Louis Catholic) was our photographer. He took school portraits of all 200+ children. We were able to print two copies of each



photo and use the first to create medical/dental files. The second copy went to the social workers for their files (the existing pictures were five years old). He also took many "action" photos that Rehema for Kids (The US Funding arm) will use for marketing and sponsoring a child campaigns. I had the pleasure of teaching soccer and netball clinics.



The highlight of our day is spending time with the children during their devotions. Each morning and evening they sing songs, recite Bible verses, and give testimonials. Jeff and Carla Picicci, the founders, are raising a great group of children to be the next generation of moral, ethical leaders in Kenya. The next few building projects include completing a three-bay workshop to have students that are not ready for high school or university to attend trade school in auto repair, welding, and carpentry.
