Embracing and Sharing Christ's Love

CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

October 31, 2021 marks the 504th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. Martin Luther was not looking to form an independent Christian tradition by nailing the 95 theses on the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany; he was simply interested in having a public discussion on the veracity of certain theological topics. There were lots of women and men across Europe who were involved in the events that transpired, which we collectively call the Reformation. Not all those people agreed about everything, but, looking back, historians and theologians have summarized the major beliefs that they *did* share with five Latin phrases. Let's spend some time reflecting on this part of our Reformed history.

Sola Gratia/Grace Alone. People cannot be good enough on their own to earn salvation. People receive salvation only because God gives it as a gift of grace, made perfect in Jesus Christ.

Sola Fide/Faith Alone. God's saving grace and love doesn't make sense to us. How can it be true that God would save us, undeserving as we are? We must have faith that it is true. We must have faith that God is as good as the Gospel says God is.

Solo Scriptura/Scripture Alone. The Bible reveals to us what God is like. While God gifts certain people with the ability to help interpret the scriptures (that's one of my jobs as a pastor), God is also able to speak directly to us through them. That means you don't "need" a religious authority to tell you what a scripture means. Wrestle with the passage long enough, and God's grace will be revealed.

Solo Christo/Christ Alone. We don't need any mediator between us and God except Christ alone. You don't need a priest or a minister to convince God that you are worth saving and loving. Christ has already done the necessary work for your salvation, and the work of Christ is sufficient.

Soli Deo Gloria/For the Glory of God Alone. Jesus has built a bridge between us and God where sin had created an impassible separation. As a result, we should live our lives in gratitude and for the glory of God alone.

Be encouraged, my friends! Believe that God's love is beyond our comprehension! As we enter November—the month of Thanksgiving—let us live with gratitude, knowing that God's grace is sufficient! Halle-lujah! Amen! $\sim Aaron$

Year End Giving

We are most grateful for membership support of our operating budget. Please consider making your planned contributions in the coming weeks. In addition to your faithful support of the church, there are some important federal income tax considerations (as of this writing):

- Even if you take the Standard Deduction on your Federal return, you can <u>still</u> deduct up to \$300 of CASH CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS from your income. The deduction is increased to \$600 for married filers in 2021.
- Avoid CAPITAL GAINS TAX by directly contributing appreciated stock from a non-retirement investment account. (Please contact Maria in the church office on the process and to ensure she identifies your contribution; brokers are not always clear).
- REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION: If you qualify for and direct a portion of your RMD to a charitable organization (Qualified Charitable Distribution-QCD) that amount is NOT taxable. However, it cannot also be included as a charitable deduction.

As always, consult your tax advisor on tax savings strategies.
